We have created many new school wide programs to create a sense of community and create good citizens. We have developed a Leadership option in Grade 7 & 8 where students work to create school wide initiatives that bring all students together and have continued with our Wilson Packs. The Packs are a whole school initiative that was developed for students to connect with students & staff in different grade levels. The Wilson Packs meet monthly and our is to goal to create positive school wide culture and sense of community. We also have a weekly newsletter, Facebook group, Instagram page, and an interactive website (with translation in several languages) to increase parental involvement and awareness of school programming, events, and information. We will continue to work with our staff and students on creating a warm and welcoming learning environment through the addition of the REACH classroom and the SAIC program. Both of these classrooms have been designed to support students who are struggling or need further intervention that is challenging to provide in a traditional classroom.

Challenges to Address

Our results indicate that citizenship across our school community can be a focal point this year. It has been challenging to meet the citizenship goals within our building when dealing with severe behavior and at risk youth. We also had a large number of students struggling with regulation and personal control which can be hard for the rest of the school population to understand. We continue to work and liaison with a variety of outside agencies to support our students & families. We are excited to look for ways to bring our school community together and provide learning opportunities and additional collaboration for all students.

The perception of education quality within our school is also a challenge for us. We continue to celebrate the work our teachers do with individualized, targeted, and universal instruction within our diverse classrooms. Universal design for learning, targeted supports, and our response to intervention models will be important areas for us to continue to explore now and in the future. Our school community will continue to explore responsibility-centered discipline practices to receive the optimal learning experiences while also promoting the development of meaningful relationships.

Evaluation

Our grade 6 math team has put several targeted supports in place to improve student's understanding on the Part A PAT. We have teachers who run an numeracy exploratory that is targeted pullout for addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. We also have no calculator components built into our unit exams. The data from these sections are tracked throughout the year across the different classes to gauge understanding and support struggling students. Our scores in this area have improved as a result of these supports. We are continuing to explore strategies to help our students work through the comprehension component in the math & science PAT. This can be a challenging component of these exams for our English as Additional Language students.

Evaluation

We have created a school wide initiative that brings all students from each grade level together to be involved in school-wide activities. This initiative is called the Wilson Packs. Every student has been designated to an "animal pack" to collaborate with other students and teachers in cross-level groupings. They will be working with two or three teachers at least once per month to focus on our "Wilson Way" character words. This initiative was developed to bring awareness to, and continue to build, a positive school culture. The goal is to promote student leadership and mentorship and a greater sense of belonging within the entire school community. We continue to promote and create a positive community culture in the area diversity. Our diversity and positive spaces committee has initiatives planned (for example, truth and reconciliation story walk, posting visuals throughout the school, diverse literature experiences, and school assemblies) to promote and help students and staff understand how our diversity is a strength and to provide representation and celebration of various cultures and members of our school community.

We have also developed a space that is shared with our wellness team and our teaching staff which allows students who are either not regulated or not engaged in school to attend throughout the day. Staff will then work with these students to ensure we are able to meet the high demands and needs of our student population in the area of mental health.
