## Trustee report:

Grade 6 survey done by 200+ students – mainly on par with provincial norms.

High sense of belonging – improvement

Positive Relationships & Friends – higher than it's ever been.

Value of School – 83% value school outcomes

Interest & Motivation

Effort – trying hard - 81% believe they are.

Feel safe attending school – above provincial average.

Someone at school providing encouragement.

Positive student teacher relationships

Clear rules and expectations for classroom behavior

**Expectations for Success** 

Someone at home providing encouragement – improvement – but lower at home than at school.

# Social media – significant issue

Grade 7 done by 121 students - quite similar to Grade 6 only slight variance.

Truancy Issues

Positive Homework Behavior - on par

Anxiety level – lower than provincial average

Depression – slightly higher

Positive Self Esteem – slightly lower – correlate with Anxiety & Depression

Vape & Tobacco use - 5% - compared to Canadian average of 6%

Marijuana & Alcohol - lower than average

Bullying – maintained – however lots of people don't understand what

bullying is – mostly happened via social media.

Feel safe attending school – can be often misinterpreted as other results like are high. Feeling positive about their school.

Changing schools - transiency

Parent Survey done – 25 respondents.

Assurance Planning - underway - will discuss next meeting.
