Evaluation

Overall citizenship continues to be an area of concern at Wilson Middle School, especially through the lens of a teacher. Parents indicate that there was significant growth in citizenship at the school but the students and teachers who are in the building on a consistent basis feel it has not improved. As a school we have initiated discussions around our character education and whether it is having the impact we are wanting it to have. We have committed to looking at how to improve our character education program and implementation. This is still in the early phase but over time we feel it will have an impact.

Our school's cell phone procedure has had a noticeable impact on students' citizenship already this year. We are hopeful that as the year progresses the impacts will continue to be felt and have a positive impact on our school community.

Evaluation

The results indicate parents are pleased with the educational experience of their child. Students and teachers feel this is an area of concern. Teachers have expressed the numbers of students in classes impact their ability to effectively provide an educational experience that is up to their standard. Teachers also feel that as the complexity of needs of students in classes increases, they are not able to adequately meet the needs of all learners. Teachers do a great job of understanding our students' learning needs, especially in literacy and numeracy and work to meet each student where they are at so they can enhance their foundational skills in these areas.

Evaluation

As a school we have strong support from the parents who are involved in their child's education. They support their child and the school community. As a school we struggle to engage all parents in decisions about their child's education. This can be due to factors such as language barriers, for our English as an additional language learners, and parents work commitments are at hours that make it difficult to engage with the school. As a school we continue to work to engage our parents. Staff at Wilson Middle School have been looking at ways to provide report cards that are translated to the language spoken in students' homes. We hope this will have an impact as parents understand where their child is at and will want to work together to support their child in their education.

We also continue to work to engage parents through consistent communication through classroom and school newsletters, presence on social media, encouraging parents to attend school council and teachers reaching out to parents through phone calls.

Wilson has great parent involvement when it comes to supporting their child in co-curricular activities. Parents show up to support their child at band concerts, athletic events as well as our drama productions.
