 - March 25 was the last trustee meeting. (minutes available at https://www.lethsd.ab.ca/download/493105)
 - Planning funds announced for new K-5 elementary school in the south end of West Lethbridge.
 - West Coulee Station Elementary School is progressing with anticipated occupancy in July 2025
 - Galbraith continues with modernization. The upgrade of Victoria Park will be moving into next phase with renovation of 3rd floor including ventilation and air conditioning.
 - High School students apply for ICE by Aprils 30
 - Indigenous Education team took Indigenous teachers for Professional Learning Day
 - Assurance survey saw increased participation
 - Robbie w/ HR staffing of West Coulee Station school has been completed. The website is up and has information regarding staff.
 - New mentorship program for 1st & 2nd year teachers.
 - Substitute Appreciation Week occurred March 10-14, 2025
 - Mike Nightengale acknowledged the support staff. Shared budget process of ATA (Alberta Teacher's Association). New report cards for elementary schools have been going well. For School Council Conference Support, it is proposed that going forward a maximum of 8 people attend with a maximum reimbursement of \$1,150 per person.
 - There was a presentation on food insecurity. Foodbank use is up 42%. Funding for Mindful Munchies has been cut. They are looking at new funding sources.
 - Transportation: for 2024/25 bus transportation was an option for K-6 students who live more than 1.0 km from the school. For 2026 Alberta Education has changed it to 1.6 km
 - School Fees discussion/tabled to April meeting.
 - Quarterly budget shared and passed.
 - Division Capital plan has been shared and is on website.
 - Probe is operating 163% core space. Chinook is 147% core space



- 7. Division School Council Report provided by Tasha
 - There was discussion on screen time policy. Concern about how screen time is used during nutrition break. More concern is at elementary school and how it is used during nutrition breaks. In Middle & High School is about content.
 - Parent learning session was about inclusive education what it is, there are 2.5 psychologists available. However no Occupational Therapist.
 - ASCA spring symposium is April 26 & AGM Apr 27. Deadline is Apr 18. Conference is virtual. Topics are listed online (website: https://www.albertaschoolcouncils.ca/)
 - There was discussion about technology evergreening what happens to the old computers? The funding for technology is donated by school councils, to the schools. It is the schools who purchase the computers. The Division indicated it is not possible to refurbish / sell the old computers. At this time the Division is not willing to consider or discuss other possibilities.
 - Assurance survey had 900 respondence versus 400 last year. The primary change was schools had control of access codes and could assist families.
 - Staffing & Budget only looking at 3-year plan. There is no increase funding for growth and funding for nutrition was cut.
 - Collective bargaining. Across the province CUPE has been in negations. However, CUPE negotiates locally where teachers negotiate provincially
